

RnR charity awarded £3,000 by Community Fund

Southwest Scotland RnR has been awarded £3,000 from the Royal Bank of Scotland thanks to an enthusiastic voting campaign by local residents.

The charity, which provides adventurous holidays for injured combatants, is based in Carsethorn. It provides accommodation, food, drink and daily entertainments and activities. RnR supporters also host dinners for the guests.
